## WHITE

Vincent Caille, Gorges, Muscadet '18 £70

Oft-overlooked, the crus of Muscadet produce wines that call out for more attention. Vincent Caille, in particular, approaches winemaking with the idea of producing Muscadet that is built to age. This wine has the familiar saline finish that typifies the region but with delicate satsuma & fennel notes that lift this well beyond the status of supermarket swill.

Pic & Chapoutier, Payrolles, Saint Peray '12 £150

A collaboration between one of France's greatest living chefs & the Rhone's preeminent house. Containing 100% Marsanne, this wine has a mixture of honey pear & citrus fruits.

Domaine Comtes Lafon, Meursault '15 £450

When it comes to Chardonnay, all roads eventually lead back to Meursault. A world-class producer in an excellent vintage. Full marks all around!

## RED

Pax Mahle, Syrah, North Coast '18 £100

Pax & Pam Mahle have a well-earned reputation in the American wine scene for their hand's off approach to winemaking & the resulting wines that taste far less of process & far more of place. This Syrah has all the peppery spice notes of its Rhone cousins with bright fresh blackberry fruits, florals & bramble.

Pahi, Escarpment Pinot Noir, Martinborough '14 £110

A stately rendition of this grape with dark, earthy sap & power to truly rival it's French cousins. This cuvee in particular has added lift from the addition of whole bunches into the ferment.

Bannockburn, Range Shiraz, Geelong '12 £120

A stalwart of the Victorian wine community with a richly deserved reputation. The range uses fruit sourced from the wineries earliest plantings of Shiraz (planted in 1974) and is only made in exceptional vintages. Make no mistake, this is Aussie Shiraz with power & meatiness but framed with silky black fruits and subtle oak spice.

Le Grappin, Gravières, Santenay 1er Cru '18 £125

Emma & Andrew Nielsen run their micro-negoce from Fanny Sabre's old winery in Beaune. Sourcing grapes from oft-overlooked parcels, Nielsen's approach is to accentuate fresher fruit character with whole-bunch fermentation whilst developing incredible velvet tannins.

Thierry Valette, Clos Puy Arnaud, Castillon Cotes de Bordeaux '14 £145

Proof positive that exceptional Bordeaux doesn't have to come from the big names of the Haut Medoc. Predominantly Merlot (70%), this wine has a rich, dark red core dressed in vanilla & notes of tobacco with some lovely tertiary notes just starting to show.

Château Beychevelle, Saint-Julien '15 £295

Roughly an even blend of Cabernet Sauvignon & Merlot with splashes of Petit Verdot & Cabernet Franc rounding out the blend. A big, dark, brooding wine with chewy tannins & black rock minerality. There's some lavish new oak in use here but it complements rather than obscures the fruit.

Gilbert et Christine Felettig, Echezeaux Grand Cru '11 £300

Few parcels of earth are more hallowed than that of the grand cru site of Echezeaux nestled into the golden hillside. A powerful wine at exactly the right stage in its development.
